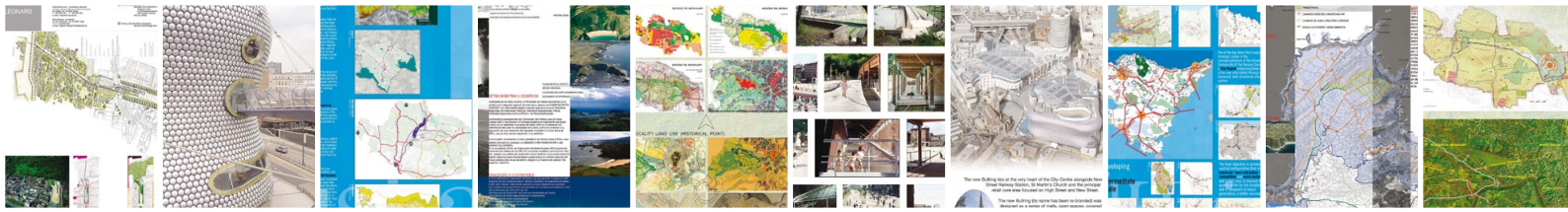

This book is composed for papers written by European spatial planners, with different perspectives on the contribution of spatial planning to the development of Europe during the last 100 years. These perspectives will range from: the historical to the present challenges; the global to more focused ones in terms of place or subject; and from one period of history to another.

One of the challenges of this book is the different views that each planner is presenting.

It is, certainly, a document that will be a reference for the future.
